





# Cases of WMSDs as percentage of Total Occupational Diseases based on Labor and Employment Sampling Survey



# Types of WMSDs based on Labor and Employment Sampling Survey (2009, 2011, 2013, 2015)



# Number of Establishments Employing 20 or More Workers by Occupational Safety and Health (OSH) Policy/Program Implemented and Major Industry, 2015-





- OSH for maritime sector, transport industry, and for migrant workers








#### **OSH Issues and Concerns**

  - Lack of OSH facilities in the regions









#### **OSH Issues and Concerns**

  - Fragmented OSH administration



- 3. Maximize OSHC's effectiveness and enhance public confidence in OSHC




